
### **Christmas Eve**




## FILM CLUB

### **Essex Air**

A new website has been launched to raise awareness of air pollution in Essex and highlight the simple actions people can take to reduce emissions and help protect themselves and their families.

The new <u>Essex Air</u> website has been created by Essex County Council on behalf of the Essex Air Quality Consortium.

The website includes a dedicated school zone, with helpful resources, a series of activities for young people, and two interactive online games to help them learn about the different types and sources of air pollution.

It also features an air pollution map and tips for how residents can help reduce their emissions and exposure to air pollution. It includes advice on changing how and when they travel and advice on how to lessen their exposure to indoor air pollutants.

Air pollution is recognised as the largest environmental risk to public health in the UK and is linked to up to 36,000 deaths each year. It reduces life expectancy by causing cardiovascular and respiratory diseases and lung cancer and can exacerbate existing health conditions, such as asthma.

In Essex, 5.5% of deaths in the county (almost 900 deaths) in 2021 were attributable to air pollution
