The Belchamp Walter pop up pub returns to whisk you away to a world of conviviality, laughter and great libations!



Survey Results

There were 17 responses to the survey, 15 of which were from people who have attended events at the village hall.

Respondents were very positive about the film club saying that it was an enjoyable evening and good value for money. Quiz nights were also rated very highly.

People felt that the hall was not very warm in winter and the chairs were not comfortable for long sessions. There were also some comments about the quality of the sound system. Unfortunately the village hall is an old, poorly insulated, building and, therefore, it is a challenge to keep the hall warm during cold weather. The village hall committee is looking at the location of the speaker to see if the sound can be improved. Unfortunately, the committee does not currently have funds available to replace the chairs.

VILLAGE ORGANISATIONS

There are several organisations in the village with differing responsibilities. These organisations include:

- Village Hall Committee
- Friends of Belchamp Walter Church
- Parochial Parish Council
- Parish Council.

Some people might not understand the roles, responsibilities and aims of these organisations, so this enews, and future e-news, will provide some background on each of these organisations, what their aims are and their membership. This e-news starts with the Friends of Belchamp Walter Church (FOBWC).

Friends of Belchamp Walter Church

This is a charity, founded in July 2021, with a purpose to "conserve, maintain, and improve the fabric, furnishings and fittings of St Mary's the Virgin Church, Belchamp Walter." FOBWC has no religious affiliation and all the funds it raises are restricted to the church building and are not used for any of the worship activities. The FOBWC meets approximately four times a year and, since its inception, has raised over £9,000.

In 2023, the FOBWC raised funds through hosting a quiz night, a plant and bake sale and a wreath making workshop followed by a wreath sale. In addition to these fundraising activities, funds are raised through people becoming a friend. These friends have set up regular standing orders to FOBWC. In 2023 these standing orders totalled £350. There was also an anonymous donation of £2,000.

The FOBWC gave £2,220 to the Parochial Parish Council to pay for the extension to the church fencing. The FOBWC has also committed to pay £4,000 towards the cost of the roofing work on the church which is planned to start in July 2024.

The FOBWC also organised the second annual church yard clean up. Thanks are due to all who came down to help clear away the brush. The churchyard is looking so much tidier and the clean up meant that the fencing could be extended.

The current FOBWC membership is as follows:
