# Pop-Up Pub Night

One of the rally participants is an organist of some repute and those in the church at the time were treated to a short impromptu organ recital. He has played at Long Melford, Lavenham and St Peters and St Gregory in Sudbury and said the Belchamp Walter organ was lovely.













#### MacMillan

One of the most popular Belchamp Walter Village Events took place on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> September. The tents were up and the sun was shining. Inside the hall the food was laid out. There was a stunning selection of cakes, and other sweets with savouries in the form of quiches, scotch eggs, sausage rolls to name a few.

Outside, the stalls included local produce, plants, and wood turned items and pottery from two talented village artisans. Other stalls included tombola, guess the weight of the cake and bean bag toss. In addition was a spectacular raffle.

The day was a great success with a steady stream of guests who spent generously and seemed to be in no hurry to leave.

The village raised £1,445.55 which is an amazing amount for a small village such as Belchamp Walter. The funds raised from this event equate to funding a MacMillan nurse, and all the expertise they provide for people affected by cancer, for over a week.

# Belchamp Walter Singers



#### **OTHER NEWS**

#### **Garden Waste**

Braintree District Council will be charging for green bin pick up from 2024. If you already have a green bin, you can continue to use this when you subscribe. For new, replacement or additional bins, a £34 one-off charge will apply per bin, plus an annual subscription fee to pay for collections.

The full-year subscription fee is £55. However, you can take advantage of a half-price early bird discount in the first year if you sign-up to the service by 30 November 2023. This will reduce the price to £27.50 for 13 months (March 24 to March 25) which works out at £1 per fortnight.

If you have previously upgraded to a 240L bin, you may continue to use this for the same price until such time as the bin needs to be replaced, at which point a 180L bin will be offered (there is no longer an option to have a 240L bin).



#### Essex County Council - Energy Switch

The Essex Energy Switch is back The Essex Energy Switch is a group buying scheme for gas and electricity. It is free to register and there is no obligation to accept an offer. The more people that register, the greater the collective buying power of the group.

Furthermore, all Energy Switch suppliers must provide 100% renewable electricity, helping to reduce carbon emissions in the county as part of a move towards net zero.

Pre-approved energy companies will bid at an auction to see who can offer the lowest energy tariff. Once the winning bidder has been selected, anyone who has registered will receive a personal offer. There's no obligation to switch – but for customers who decided to proceed, the process is taken care of by the winning supplier.

Registration can be done online at <a href="www.essex.gov.uk/energyswitch">www.essex.gov.uk/energyswitch</a>, or by calling the Big Community Switch registration line on 0800 048 8439 to register and receive correspondence by post. Lines are open Monday to Friday, 8am to 5.30pm. If you are looking to sign up you should have a recent energy bill to hand.
