The Essex Highways link above allows you to report other defects as well. The blocked storm drains on Otten Road, the corner on the hill before the entrance to Eyston Farms, frequently cause flooding. This is dangerous as it is on a blind bend and cars are often on the wrong side of the road to avoid the water. The matter was reported to highways but it was deemed not to be a priority, so, unfortunately we will have to live with the flooding until it is cleaned as part of the regular maintenance schedule.

Essex County Council – Consultation Booking Process at Recycling Centres

Essex County Council has launched a consultation on the booking process currently being trialled at Essex recycling centres. An evaluation of the booking process has shown that, based on user survey feedback, overall satisfaction with the booking system is high. The consultation is now open to gather resident's views on whether to keep the booking process permanently at all sites.
